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Single Malt Scotch Whisky

Single Malt Scotch Whisky is whisky produced from a single distillery and made solely from malted barley, and aged in used barrels for a minimum of three years. Each region has developed its own hallmarks and styles, and the landscape is indelibly imprinted upon each bottle.

Islay Malts

Islay (“island,” in Gaelic) lies off the southwestern coast of Scotland, amongst the beautiful Hebrides islands. Its whiskys are typically known for their smoky, briny, and full-bodied characteristics. Most distilleries on Islay use malted barley that has been smoked using peat moss, which is essentially condensed vegetation. Two distilleries, Bunnahabhain and Bruichladdich, traditionally have not peated their malts, although both do make some peated expressions.
